Reading

Science

Research different types of rocks. Create a list of the rocks that you find and write some interesting facts about them.



Challenge: State whether the rocks are igneous, sedimentary or metamorphic.

Design Technology

Investigate objects that use air to make them work e.g. bicycle pump, balloon, inflatable swimming aids, foot pump for inflating an air bed. What does the air do? How has it been used in the design of these products?

Physical Education

Create your own gymnastics floor sequence with 5 parts. Try to include rolls, balances and movements. When you are done you can evaluate your performance and take photos of you doing it. Upload this to seesaw or write and stick it in your book.

Computing

Create a poster about emailing safely.

You must include:

- Why we use email.
- What is good about emailing.
- What we need to keep private
- What to do if you are worried about emails that you get.



Topic

Research Viking transport and longboats. Design and label your own in your homework book and then make a model of it.
