Areas of learning

As historians we will explore the importance of communication and the different ways that there are to communicate around the world. We will identify different languages that are spoken throughout multicultural Britain today and investigate where some of the words that we use originated from. Finally, we will compare and contrast hieroglyphs that were used by the Ancient Mayan and Egyptian civilisations.

As scientists we will identify and describe the different parts of flowering plants whilst exploring the requirements for plants to live and grow. Also, we will explore the role of plants in the life cycle.

As designers we will begin to use our new electrical 'crumble' resources to experiment with and create working electrical circuits. We will use the linked software to program these to make a working nightlight linked to our light topic and the Orion and the Dark text we are studying in shared reading.
